THAT COUNCIL NOTES THE FOLLOWING ADVICE OF THE ADELAIDE PARK LANDS AUTHORITY:

1. Advice 1 - Response to Park 2 AFC Proposal

THAT THE ADELAIDE PARK LANDS AUTHORITY ADVISES COUNCIL

That the Adelaide Park Lands Authority provides the following-input on the Adelaide Football Club (AFC) proposal released for consultation in December 2019 for a combined training, administrative, community and aquatic facility in Denise Norton Park / Pardipardinyilla (Park 2), in accordance with the Adelaide Parklands Act 2005:

- The extent of the proposed AFC training, administrative and commercial components appears potentially inconsistent with the Statutory Principles in the Adelaide Park Lands Act 2005 (SA) (particularly that the Park Lands exist for the public benefit of the people of South Australia) and the provisions of the Adelaide Park Lands Management Strategy that support use of the Park Lands for community outdoor recreation and ancillary infrastructure, but not large-scale commercial facilities. Council might seek specific legal advice about this.
- Seeks further information regarding the extent of any administrative and commercial components and its consistency with the Statutory Principles in the Adelaide Park Lands Act 2005 (SA) (particularly that the Park Lands exist for the public benefit of the people of South Australia) and the provisions of the Adelaide Park Lands Management Strategy
- 3. Recommends an Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation (EBPC) Act self-assessment and referral process in regard to any possible effect on the values which underpin the National Heritage Listing of the Adelaide Park Lands and City Layout.
- 4. Recommends that the Guiding Principles established by City of Adelaide to assess the AFC proposal need amendment to specifically incorporate and fully reflect the Statutory Principles in the Adelaide Park Lands Act 2005 (SA) and requirements of the Local Government Act 1999 (SA) along with the policy provisions in the Adelaide Park Lands Management Strategy, the Community Land Management Plan and the relevant provisions of the existing City of Adelaide Development Plan.

2. Advice 2 - Submission to the Planning and Design Code consultation

THAT THE ADELAIDE PARK LANDS AUTHORITY ADVISES THE STATE GOVERNMENT AND COUNCIL

That the Adelaide Park Lands Authority:

- Recommends that a self-assessment and referral process is undertaken regarding any possible effect the P&D Code may have on the values which underpin the National Heritage Listing of the Adelaide Park Lands and City Layout.
- 2. Provides the following comments on the draft P& D Code as Attachment A: Summary of Changes and Proposed Amendments to Item 9.2 on the Agenda for the meeting of the Board of the Adelaide Park Lands Authority held on 6 February 2020:
 - 2.1. Supports the recognition of the special attributes of the Adelaide Park Lands through inclusion of a dedicated Zone in the P&D Code.
 - 2.2. Suggests renaming City Park Lands Zone to Adelaide Park Lands Zone.
 - 2.3. Suggests that the boundary of the Adelaide Park Lands Zone should include the six squares which are a part of the Adelaide Park Lands.
 - 2.4. Suggest the deletion of the proposed Subzones in favour of comprehensive Zone wide policies.
 - 2.5. Strengthens policies to prevent inappropriate development (land uses and built form) in the Adelaide Park Lands Zone noting the removal of the current non-complying pathway.
 - 2.6. Includes within the 'Desired Outcomes' of the Zone more descriptive policies to protect and enhance the unique features of the Adelaide Park Lands.
 - 2.7. Revises the 'Built-form and Character' provisions to provide greater clarity regarding new buildings in the Adelaide Park Lands, including the incorporation of the City of Adelaide's Park Lands Building Design Guidelines (under development) into the P&D Code; or being adopted as a Design Standard to further support high quality Park Lands building design.
 - 2.8. The unique planning considerations for the zone warrant zone specific policy content on matters including movement and parking, advertising and fencing (rather than the general policy that applies across other zones that does not adequately recognise the unique qualities of the Adelaide Park Lands).
 - 2.9. Supports public notification where it involves all other code assessed development assessments; however, suggest minor types of development that are currently not subject to notification be exempt from public notification.
 - 2.10. Suggests reinstatement and addition of mapping and / or concept plans to support a clearer statutory planning framework.
 - 2.11. Suggests educational establishment, hotel and public infrastructure should be Code Assessed (Performance Assessed) Development rather than Restricted Development.
- 3. Supports further updates to the P&D Code following introduction of the initial version in July 2020 to reflect current strategies that relate to the Adelaide Park Lands (as already identified by Council).
- 3. Advice 3 Kaurna Community Hub in the Adelaide Park Lands

THAT THE ADELAIDE PARK LANDS AUTHORITY ADVISES COUNCIL

That the Adelaide Park Lands Authority:

- 1. Supports the Kaurna Yerta Aboriginal Corporation Incorporated (KYAC) using the North Adelaide Railway Station Building as a Kaurna Community Hub to provide a base from which to deliver cultural, economic and social development activities.
- 2. Requests the administration to coordinate preparation of a detailed scope of works and plans to inform further decision-making.
- 3. Supports administration commencing lease negotiations with KYAC for the use and occupation of the North Adelaide Railway Station Building in accordance with the Park Lands Leasing and Licensing Policy.

- 1.2. Requests the urgent attention and action of the Minister for Planning and State Planning Commission to commence and complete this necessary work for implementation by 1 July 2020 with the Planning and Design Code.
- 1.3. Requests the State Planning Commission collaborate with the City of Adelaide to ensure that all relevant public realm matters are encapsulated appropriately in either the Planning and Design Code or a City of Adelaide Design Standard
- 1.4. Express Council's significant concerns with the amendments that the *Planning*, *Development and Infrastructure Act 2016* (SA) makes to Sections 221 and 222 of the *Local Government Act 1999* (SA) and make recommendations about how adverse impacts could be avoided, including the following:
 - 1.4.1. Not proclaiming Schedule 6, Part 7 (*Amendment of the Local Government Act 1999*) of the *Planning, Development and Infrastructure Act 2016* (SA), to allow for further investigations to be undertaken to understand the impacts and put appropriate measures in place to avoid adverse impacts.
 - 1.4.2. Requests the State Planning Commission write a Practice Direction and/or Practice Guideline to clearly state that the planning approvals process should not consider construction matters and management of the use the public realm and that these remain within the ambit of Section 221 and 222 of the *Local Government Act 1999*.
 - 1.4.3. Ensures public realm matters are encapsulated appropriately in either the Planning and Design Code or Design Standards for implementation by 1 July 2020.
 - 1.4.4. Investigates whether under the *Planning, Development and Infrastructure Act 2016* (SA), if any standard conditions on a Development Application may resolve some matters currently dealt with by a Section 221/222 permit.
 - 1.4.5. Investigates the further legislative impacts of the amendment and puts in place appropriate measures to ensure procedural processes are in place by 1 July 2020.
- 2. Authorises the Chief Executive Officer to finalise the submission on the draft Planning and Design Code that incorporates the details of this report and recommendations of the Council.

 - 3.3. Ensure every South Australian is notified of the changes proposed to their property to meet the PDI Act and Community Engagement Charter;
 - 3.4. The opportunity to test the effect of the proposed Code in the ePlanning system (as originally proposed for in the announced transition process); and
 - 3.5. Provide adequate time to prepare for the full implementation of the changes, including the considerable integration works required to Council's business systems in order to maintain current business operations and service levels to our community.

- 2. The date on which the Council register of interests was updated to reflect these new employment arrangements
- 3. If any member of the Administration sought legal advice about Councillor Abiad's appointment in Saudi Arabia and the nature of that advice?'

- '1. Houssam Abiad formally resigned as a Councillor on 29 January 2020, effective immediately.
- 2. The Administration have not been advised of the nature of Houssam Abiad's private business interests in Saudi Arabia.
- 3. A Council Member must update the Register of Interest within one month of a notifiable change (section 67(1) of the *Local Government Act 1999 (SA)* (the Act).
- 4. This section does not extend to former Council Members.
- 5. No legal advice was obtained by Administration on the nature of Mr Abiad's private business interests in Saudi Arabia.'

At the opening of State Parliament on February 5th, the Marshall Government foreshadowed a priority was to construct an entertainment hub at either the railyards adjacent to the new health precinct or, among competing proposals, on the southern end of the Adelaide Golf Course.

Could the Administration advise;

- i) Have there been discussions, formal or informal, between the Lord Mayor or any member of the Administration with the State Government or any other party, including representatives of Adelaide Venue Management Corporation, about any part of the Park Lands constituting the Golf Course or around the Golf Course being developed or an entertainment hub or stadium
- ii) If so, what has been the nature of those discussions
- iii) Is the one-year delay in the release of the Golf Course master Plan related to the possibility of development on that part of the Park Lands
- iv) Have there been discussions, formal or informal, between the Lord Mayor or any member of the Administration with the State Government or any other party, including representatives of Adelaide Venue Management Corporation, about any part of the Park Lands on or around the railyards mentioned above being developed or an entertainment hub or stadium
- v) If so, what has been the nature of those discussions
- vi) If there have been any discussions as in ii) and v) when will the elected body be fully briefed?'

The Lord Mayor read the following reply:

- '1. No discussions have occurred between the Lord Mayor and the State Government or any other party, including representatives of Adelaide Venue Management Corporation (AVMC), about any part of the Park Lands constituting the Golf Course or around the Golf Course being developed for an entertainment hub or stadium.
- 2. The timing of the release of the draft Golf Course Master Plan, which has not yet been endorsed by council, is not related in any way to the possibility of development on that part of the Park Lands. The Administration are reviewing the draft Master Plan in light of the projected costs, benefits and current golfing trends and will present back to Council once reviewed.
- 3. No discussions have occurred between the Lord Mayor with the State Government or any other party, including representatives of AVMC, about any part of the Park Lands on or around the railyards mentioned above being developed or an entertainment hub or stadium
- 4. In September 2018 the CEO, the then Director Services and Director Growth were invited to meet with a consultant engaged by AVMC, regarding consideration for a future city stadium. Commentary was high level and broad in nature, and related to types of users and stadia infrastructure in other jurisdictions.
- 5. Following media activity last year detailing the potential for an inner-city stadium on or around the railyards, the CEO met with the CEO of the AVMC to seek clarity regarding the concept. The conversation was of a high-level nature and the CEO requested that if and when such a concept was progressed, the CEO of the AVMC would provide a briefing for Council Members.
- 6. The CEO was then asked by the AVMC to participate in a peer review of the inner-city stadium concept at the railyards. Given the fact that no details were provided of the proposal, comments made by the CEO were limited to the potential impacts and limitations on the parklands site.
- 7. As a result of recent media activity regarding potential city stadium options has now occurred, the CEO will formally seek a briefing for Council Members from the CEO of the AVMC and the CEO of the Adelaide Oval Stadium Management Authority.'

THAT THE ADELAIDE PARK LANDS AUTHORITY ADVISES COUNCIL

That the Adelaide Park Lands Authority provides the following-input on the Adelaide Football Club (AFC) proposal released for consultation in December 2019 for a combined training, administrative, community and aquatic facility in Denise Norton Park / Pardipardinyilla (Park 2), in accordance with the Adelaide Parklands Act 2005:

- 1. The extent of the proposed AFC training, administrative and commercial components appears potentially inconsistent with the Statutory Principles in the Adelaide Park Lands Act 2005 (SA) (particularly that the Park Lands exist for the public benefit of the people of South Australia) and the provisions of the Adelaide Park Lands Management Strategy that support use of the Park Lands for community outdoor recreation and ancillary infrastructure, but not large-scale commercial facilities. Council might seek specific legal advice about this.
- 2. Seeks further information regarding the extent of any administrative and commercial components and its consistency with the Statutory Principles in the Adelaide Park Lands Act 2005 (SA) (particularly that the Park Lands exist for the public benefit of the people of South Australia) and the provisions of the Adelaide Park Lands Management Strategy

- Recommends an Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation (EBPC) Act selfassessment and referral process in regard to any possible effect on the values which underpin the National Heritage Listing of the Adelaide Park Lands and City Layout.
- 4. Recommends that the Guiding Principles established by City of Adelaide to assess the AFC proposal need amendment to specifically incorporate and fully reflect the Statutory Principles in the Adelaide Park Lands Act 2005 (SA) and requirements of the Local Government Act 1999 (SA) along with the policy provisions in the Adelaide Park Lands Management Strategy, the Community Land Management Plan and the relevant provisions of the existing City of Adelaide Development Plan.

THAT THE ADELAIDE PARK LANDS AUTHORITY ADVISES THE STATE GOVERNMENT AND COUNCIL

That the Adelaide Park Lands Authority:

- 1. Recommends that a self-assessment and referral process is undertaken regarding any possible effect the P&D Code may have on the values which underpin the National Heritage Listing of the Adelaide Park Lands and City Layout.
- 2. Provides the following comments on the draft P& D Code as Attachment A: Summary of Changes and Proposed Amendments to Item 9.2 on the Agenda for the meeting of the Board of the Adelaide Park Lands Authority held on 6 February 2020:
 - 2.1. Supports the recognition of the special attributes of the Adelaide Park Lands through inclusion of a dedicated Zone in the P&D Code.
 - 2.2. Suggests renaming City Park Lands Zone to Adelaide Park Lands Zone.
 - 2.3. Suggests that the boundary of the Adelaide Park Lands Zone should include the six squares which are a part of the Adelaide Park Lands.
 - 2.4. Suggest the deletion of the proposed Subzones in favour of comprehensive Zone wide policies.
 - 2.5. Strengthens policies to prevent inappropriate development (land uses and built form) in the Adelaide Park Lands Zone noting the removal of the current non-complying pathway.
 - 2.6. Includes within the 'Desired Outcomes' of the Zone more descriptive policies to protect and enhance the unique features of the Adelaide Park Lands.
 - 2.7. Revises the 'Built-form and Character' provisions to provide greater clarity regarding new buildings in the Adelaide Park Lands, including the incorporation of the City of Adelaide's Park Lands Building Design Guidelines (under development) into the P&D Code; or being adopted as a Design Standard to further support high quality Park Lands building design.
 - 2.8. The unique planning considerations for the zone warrant zone specific policy content on matters including movement and parking, advertising and fencing (rather than the general policy that applies across other zones that does not adequately recognise the unique qualities of the Adelaide Park Lands).
 - 2.9. Supports public notification where it involves all other code assessed development assessments; however, suggest minor types of development that are currently not subject to notification be exempt from public notification.
 - 2.10. Suggests reinstatement and addition of mapping and / or concept plans to support a clearer statutory planning framework.
 - 2.11. Suggests educational establishment, hotel and public infrastructure should be Code Assessed (Performance Assessed) Development rather than Restricted Development.
- 3. Supports further updates to the P&D Code following introduction of the initial version in July 2020 to reflect current strategies that relate to the Adelaide Park Lands (as already identified by Council).
- 3. Advice 3 Kaurna Community Hub in the Adelaide Park Lands

QUESTION ON NOTICE

Deputy Lord Mayor (Councillor Hyde) will ask the following Question on Notice:

'Could the Administration provide details of the public realm budget over the past 6 years?

Has the budget been increased by CPI for each of those financial years?

Have there been increases to this budget that reflect the need to maintain new horticultural, civil and other public realm assets as they are completed?

Does the Administration currently have a methodology applied annually to calculate the cost of maintaining new public realm assets as they are completed?

Noting significant additions and enhancements to the public realm the city must maintain, such as Rundle Mall, Gawler Place, Bank Street, Anzac Centenary Memorial Walk, Topham Mall, Hindley Street (west), Victoria Square, as well as a number of greening and horticultural projects, could the administration detail the assets built, upgraded or transferred to our ownership that require maintenance out of the public realm budget for that 6 year period?'

REPLY

- 1. The Public Realm budget has increased from \$22.3 million in 2014/15 to \$28.3 million in 2019/20, representing an increase of 27% over a 6-year period. The last three financial years represent an increase of \$1 million.
- 2. Over the six-year period, the budget has increased above Adelaide CPI, 2018/19 being an exception when the budget increase (2.3%) was below the CPI (2.7%). In 2015/16 \$1.5 million was injected for road and footpath maintenance.
- 3. Our method for determining the cost of maintaining all of the public realm is based on achieving the appropriate levels of service for the community. Based on historical evidence, maintenance plans, community feedback/expectation and the application of best practice we aim to achieve the right balance of maintaining our assets efficiently. For new and upgraded assets, often the level of service and community expectation is less defined as we don't have the historical data to support the resources, materials, frequencies and level of effort required to maintain the asset. Typically this is determined through multiple budget cycles and can adapt over time. The type of maintenance can also differ depending on the age and type of asset created. For example, a new streetscape project may result in less road maintenance activity (pot hole repairs) but may introduce a horticulture maintenance cost due to the introduction of street trees.

4. There have been significant enhancements and upgrades to the CoA public realm over the past 6 years as noted in the Question. Our maintenance planning processes are in place for these created assets, the true cost of which is dependent on our asset management plans, maintenance plans and the continual monitoring of cost versus level of service expectation of these assets for the community. We anticipate the cost of maintenance of these new assets to incrementally increase over time.

- 3. A Council Member must update the Register of Interest within one month of a notifiable change (section 67(1) of the *Local Government Act 1999 (SA)* (the Act).
 - This section does not extend to former Council Members.
- 4. No legal advice was obtained by Administration on the nature of Mr Abiad's private business interests in Saudi Arabia.

QUESTION ON NOTICE

Councillor Martin will ask the following Question on Notice:

'On the December 11th, 2018 during debate of a motion to release the Golf Course Master Plan, which was defeated by the majority faction of Council, the Administration suggested that the Master Plan would be revealed in "March 2019".

At the opening of State Parliament on February 5th, the Marshall Government foreshadowed a priority was to construct an entertainment hub at either the railyards adjacent to the new health precinct or, among competing proposals, on the southern end of the Adelaide Golf Course.

Could the Administration advise;

- i) Have there been discussions, formal or informal, between the Lord Mayor or any member of the Administration with the State Government or any other party, including representatives of Adelaide Venue Management Corporation, about any part of the Park Lands constituting the Golf Course or around the Golf Course being developed or an entertainment hub or stadium
- ii) If so, what has been the nature of those discussions
- iii) Is the one-year delay in the release of the Golf Course master Plan related to the possibility of development on that part of the Park Lands
- iv) Have there been discussions, formal or informal, between the Lord Mayor or any member of the Administration with the State Government or any other party, including representatives of Adelaide Venue Management Corporation, about any part of the Park Lands on or around the railyards mentioned above being developed or an entertainment hub or stadium
- v) If so, what has been the nature of those discussions
- vi) If there have been any discussions as in ii) and v) when will the elected body be fully briefed?'

REPLY

- 1. No discussions have occurred between the Lord Mayor and the State Government or any other party, including representatives of Adelaide Venue Management Corporation (AVMC), about any part of the Park Lands constituting the Golf Course or around the Golf Course being developed for an entertainment hub or stadium.
- 2. The timing of the release of the draft Golf Course Master Plan, which has not yet been endorsed by council, is not related in any way to the possibility of development on that part of the Park Lands. The Administration are reviewing the draft Master Plan in light of the projected costs, benefits and current golfing trends and will present back to Council once reviewed.

- 3. No discussions have occurred between the Lord Mayor with the State Government or any other party, including representatives of AVMC, about any part of the Park Lands on or around the railyards mentioned above being developed or an entertainment hub or stadium
- 4. In September 2018 the CEO, the then Director Services and Director Growth were invited to meet with a consultant engaged by AVMC, regarding consideration for a future city stadium. Commentary was high level and broad in nature, and related to types of users and stadia infrastructure in other jurisdictions.
- 5. Following media activity last year detailing the potential for an inner-city stadium on or around the railyards, the CEO met with the CEO of the AVMC to seek clarity regarding the concept. The conversation was of a high-level nature and the CEO requested that if and when such a concept was progressed, the CEO of the AVMC would provide a briefing for Council Members.
- 6. The CEO was then asked by the AVMC to participate in a peer review of the inner-city stadium concept at the railyards. Given the fact that no details were provided of the proposal, comments made by the CEO were limited to the potential impacts and limitations on the parklands site.
- 7. As a result of recent media activity regarding potential city stadium options has now occurred, the CEO will formally seek a briefing for Council Members from the CEO of the AVMC and the CEO of the Adelaide Oval Stadium Management Authority.
