'The City of Adelaide Reconciliation Committee acknowledges that we are meeting on traditional Country of the Kurna people of the Adelaide Plains and pays respect to Elders past and present. We recognise and respect their cultural heritage, beliefs and relationship with the land. We acknowledge that they are of continuing importance to the Kurna people living today.

And we also extend that respect to other Aboriginal Language Groups and other First Nations who are present today.'

 - Anita Allen, Director Planning and Development, Brett Steiner, Manager Planning Operations accompanied by Michael Sherry (nWCH project) from the Attorney-General's Department provided an overview of the Riverbank Precinct Code Amendment that has been released for consultation by the Chief Executive, Attorney General's Department

- Item 5.1 – Riverbank Precinct Code Amendment
 - Rick Hutchins, Manager City Planning & Heritage (CoA) sought advice from the Reconciliation Committee to inform the Council response on the proposed policy changes to the Planning and Design Code initiated through the Riverbank Precinct Code Amendment
 - During discussion the Reconciliation Committee noted Attachment A providing a summary of the key policy changes proposed in the Riverbank Precinct Code Amendment and that its advice would be incorporated with the Council response being drafted and to be presented to a Special meeting of the Council being held on 26 October 2021

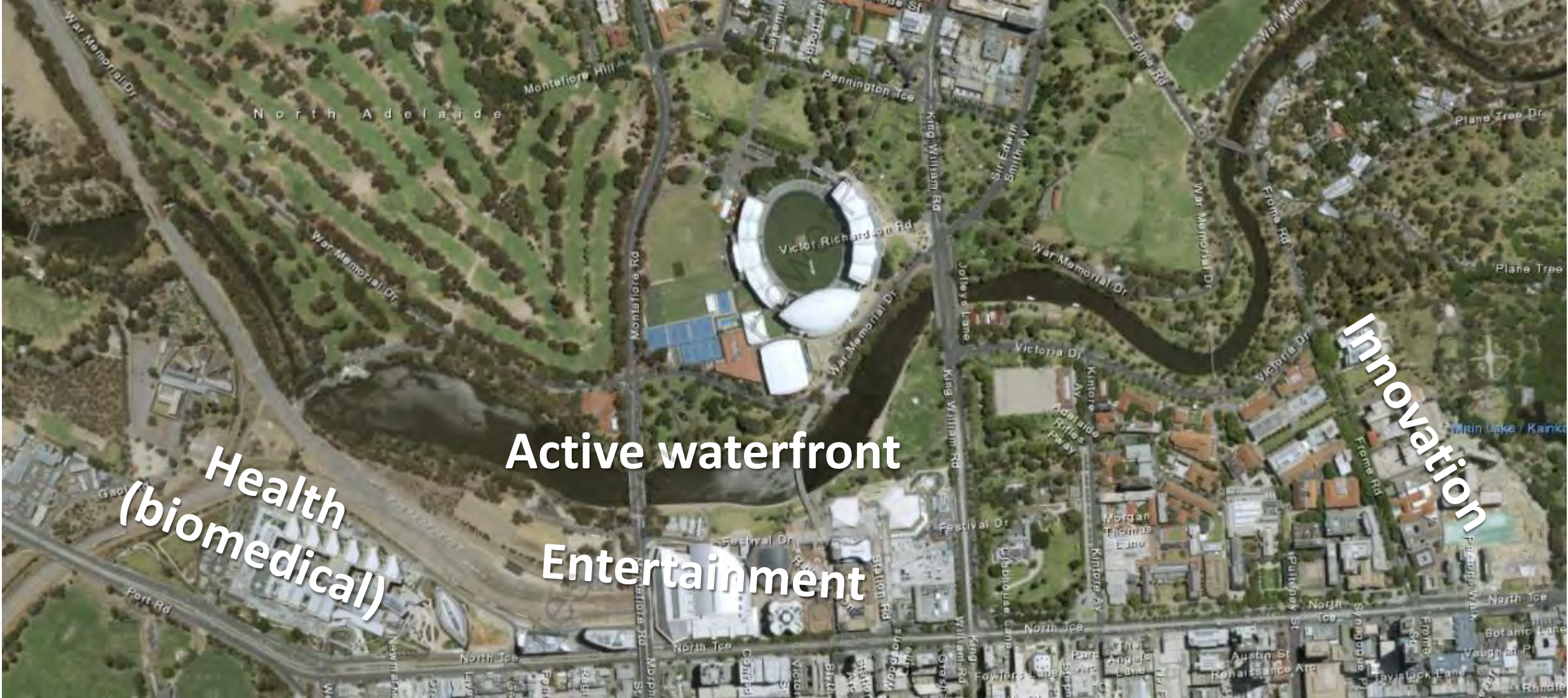

Health (Biomedical) Precinct⁸

The former railyards to the west of Morphett Street Bridge have been transformed to become Adelaide Biomed City, one of the most significant biomedical precincts in the southern hemisphere



Health (Biomedical) Precinct⁹

- Expand Health Subzone to the west
- New policies seek to:
 - improve connections to park lands
 - improve pedestrian connectivity and interface with the park lands
- No change to heritage listings
- More scope for adaptive reuse of Gaol and Police Barracks



Entertainment Precinct

The Entertainment Precinct attracts millions of interstate and international visitors to the State, many of which will spend extensive time within this small part of the City



Entertainment Precinct

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- Expand Entertainment Subzone to the north of railway line
- Also provide for health, education or research type land uses in the subzone
- New policy seeks:
 - An active edge to the river
 - A pedestrian and cycle path along the river
 - Development of high amenity, with a transition down in scale to the river
 - Improved east-west connections through the RAH and over Montefiore Road
 - Provide connections between North Terrace and the Riverbank in the InterContinental forecourt





Active waterfront precinct

A focus on activities that support activation of the waterfront while ensuring the Park Lands setting and open character is protected and enhanced



Active waterfront precinct

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- New Riverbank Subzone in the Adelaide Park Lands Zone to activate the waterfront
- Opportunities for small, low-scale shops, cafes, community, cultural and tourism activities
- Protect pedestrian and bicycle movement along the riverbank
- High quality design that complements the landscaped setting
- Includes policy to protect cultural sites within Adelaide Park Lands





Innovation precinct

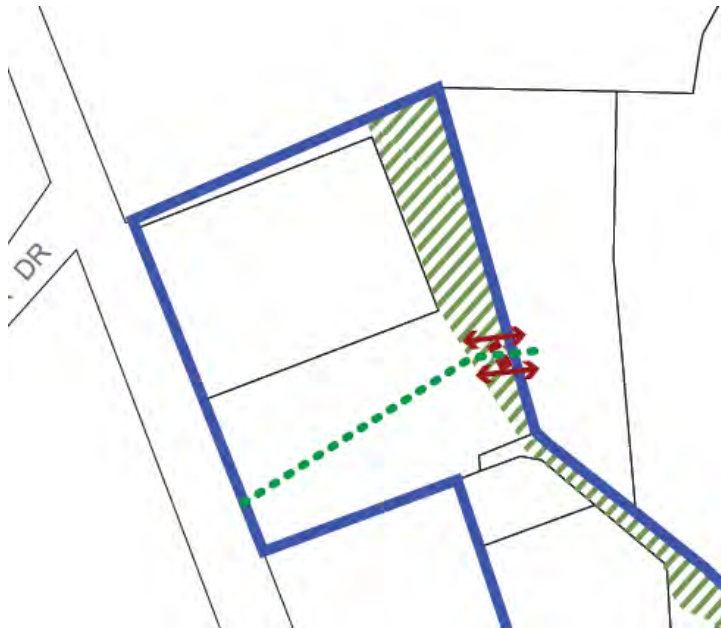
A focus on innovation, entrepreneurship, research, education, culture, and tourism - to grow jobs and the South Australian economy








Innovation precinct

- Expand Innovation Subzone to the north
- Amend concept plan and insert new policy to protect open space link from Frome Road to Botanic Gardens

Cultural Heritage

- Specific policy within the Adelaide Park Lands Zone protect areas and items of cultural significance or special landscape character
- *Aboriginal Heritage Act 1988* to provides protection of Aboriginal sites, objects or remains whether previously recorded or not.
