Safer Place to Gather & CBD update

- New Parklands Licence Agreement to 30 June 2026.
- Strengthening coordinated service provision e.g. TB screening, shower service provided by One Voice and delivered by Puddle Jumpers.
- Recently requested updated environmental health assessment from the Chief Public Health Officer following earlier recommendations and implementation.
- Continue to improve amenities for people noting Safer Place to Gather is a light touch, temporary model.
- Collaborating with key stakeholders ahead of the summer period.
- Establishing a Night Patrol response for the Adelaide CBD in addition to MAPS.
- Promoting the use of Return to Country service.

Options to support visitors from remote and regional Aboriginal communities

- Safety and Wellbeing Taskforce met again with Iwiri Aboriginal Corporation on 22 October 2025 to continue discussion re support for remote Anangu visitors.
- DHS has finalised the Terms of Reference for the Outline Business Case. Stakeholders, including the City of Adelaide, consulted.
- Procurement to engage consultants is underway. Areas of expertise include:
 - Financial modelling, risk assessment, and regulation/legislation.
 - Demonstrated Aboriginal cultural expertise to support culturally informed recommendations, strengthen community engagement, and ensure alignment with First Nations protocols and perspectives.
- Outline Business Case timeline late January 2026.







Outline Business Case

- Engage Aboriginal leaders, communities, Elders, key stakeholders, and service providers throughout the modelling.
- Map current accommodation services and identify gaps.
- Assess up to three models including a 'do nothing' option (noting this could include cessation of SPTG), a full visitor park highlighted during the Short-Term Responses for Remote Visitors to Adelaide Forum in March 2025 and a hybrid model (could involve multiple, smaller sites), to be determined.
- Note options will include non-CBD locations as well as CBD where appropriate
- Evaluate financial, social, and cultural impacts of each option.
- Recommend preferred option for development and full business case.
