We recognise and respect their cultural heritage, beliefs and relationship with the land.

We acknowledge that they are of continuing importance to the Kaurna people living today.

And we also extend that respect to other Aboriginal Language Groups and other First Nations who are present today.'

- It was identified that SA Voice to Parliament representation was in transition
- The achievements of the year were acknowledged
- Congratulations extended to all participants/recipients at the Open Access College 2024 Awards Ceremony held at Norwood Concert Hall on 4 December 2024
- It was identified that prior to the launch of a Reconciliation Portal, Committee Members would be introduced to the Portal and provided with assistance in its use.
