EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The City of Adelaide has been successful in its grant funding application with the Department for Infrastructure and Transport (DIT) through the 2023/24 State Bicycle Fund.

\$200,000 has been approved for funding to install a new bicycle pedestrian actuated crossing adjacent to the Park Lands Trail on Hutt Road and \$197,500 has been approved to upgrade two shared use pathways within Rymill Park /Murlawirrapurka (Park 14) to provide lighting.

The total project cost for the installation of a new bicycle pedestrian actuated crossing adjacent to the Park Lands Trail on Hutt Road is \$1.11 million and the total project cost of the upgrades to two shared use pathways within Rymill Park to provide lighting is \$497,500.

The purpose of this report is to formalise the successful grant application via execution of a Funding Deed with the Minister for Infrastructure and Transport, which requires a resolution of Council to affix the Common Seal to the Funding Deed.

- 2. Authorises the Lord Mayor and Chief Executive Officer to affix the Common Seal of the Council to the State Bicycle Funding Deed.

DISCUSSION

- 1. The City of Adelaide applied for grant funding through the 2023/2024 State Bicycle Fund Program and was successful in the application.
- 2. Subject to execution of the Funding Deed, Council will receive:
 - 2.1 \$200,000 to install a new bicycle pedestrian actuated crossing adjacent to the Park Lands Trail on Hutt Road. Refer to Link 1 view <u>here</u>, for the artist impression.
 - 2.2 \$197,500 to upgrade two shared use pathways within Rymill Park to provide lighting. Refer to Link 2 view <u>here</u>, for the concept designs.
- 3. The total project cost for the installation of a new bicycle pedestrian actuated crossing adjacent to the Park Lands Trail on Hutt Road is \$1.11 million and the total project cost of the upgrades to two shared use pathways within Rymill Park to provide lighting is \$497,500.
- 4. The Rymill Park shared use path project will upgrade two shared use pathways in the locality of the eastern side of the lake. Path 1 is approximately 360m and Path 2 is approximately 100m, where both paths provide access between Dequetteville Terrace and Rymill Lake.
- 5. To formalise this grant funding, Council is required to enter into a Deed with the Minister for Infrastructure and Transport.
- 6. Section 38 of the *Local Government Act 1999 (SA)* requires a resolution of Council in order to affix the Common Seal.
- 7. Upon signing of the Funding Deed, the funding period is until 30 June 2024.
