## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

In early 2023 Council began separating the City of Adelaide Standing Orders (the Standing Orders) into a series of standalone Policies and Codes of Practice. It is proposed that the Civic Protocols (Part 8 of the Standing Orders) is revoked and replaced with the Civic Recognition and Protocol Policy (the draft Policy). Any residual remainder of the Standing Orders, including administrative sections, are also proposed to be revoked as detailed in this report, completing the transition to stand alone policies and codes of practice.

The draft Policy was presented to Council on 27 February 2024 and was subsequently deferred to a later meeting of the City Finance and Governance Committee. This revised draft Policy as contained in **Attachment A** seeks to ensure continuity and provide clarity surrounding decision making, civic protocols and forms of civic recognition. An updated table of amendments is included in this report.

The Civic Recognition Working Group (CRWG) was originally established under a now rescinded section of the *Standing Orders*. A review of the function of the CRWG has been undertaken, and the delegations for decision-making are now included in the draft Policy to further enable efficiency and clarity. At its final meeting on 6 February 2024 the CRWG endorsed the draft Policy and the consequential disbandment of the group. It is proposed that should Council adopt the draft Policy, the CRWG will be disbanded and the items previously considered by the CRWG will be referred to the City Community Services and Culture Committee for recommendation to Council.

## RECOMMENDATION

The following recommendation will be presented to Council on 28 May 2024 for consideration.

#### THAT THE CITY FINANCE AND GOVERNANCE COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS

#### THAT COUNCIL:

- 1. Adopts the Civic Recognition and Protocol Policy as contained in Attachment A to Item 7.5 on the City Finance and Governance Committee Agenda on 21 May 2024.
- 2. Revokes Part 8 of the City of Adelaide Standing Orders and the residual remainder as adopted by Council in June 2022.
- 3. Notes that the City Community Services and Culture Committee will consider and make recommendations for items that require a decision of Council under the Civic Recognition and Protocol Policy.
- 4. Notes that at the next committee structure review a report will be provided regarding the feasibility of establishing a committee under section 41 of the *Local Government Act 1999* (SA) for the purposes of Civic Recognition.
- 5. Notes that the Civic Recognition Working Group will be disbanded upon adoption of the Civic Recognition and Protocol Policy as contained in Attachment A to Item 7.5 on the Agenda of the City Finance and Governance Committee on 21 May 2024.

## DISCUSSION

- 1. In early 2023, Council decided to separate its Standing Orders into a series of standalone policies and Codes of Practice.
- 2. The Civic Protocols (Chapter 8 of the Standing Orders) (Link 1 view <a href="here">here</a>), the Civic Recognition Operating Guidelines (Link 2 view <a href="here">here</a>) and the Adelaide Town Hall Lighting Operating Guidelines (Link 3 view <a href="here">here</a>) have been combined into a draft Civic Recognition and Protocol Policy (Attachment A).
- 3. The draft Policy was considered by the Civic Recognition Working Group (CRWG) at its meeting on 6 February 2024. Feedback provided by CRWG has been incorporated into the draft Policy.
- 4. The draft Policy was then considered by the City Finance and Governance Committee on 20 February 2024 (Link 3 view <a href="here">here</a>) and was subsequently recommended to Council for decision on 27 February 2024.
- 5. At the meeting of Council 27 February 2024, it was resolved that the matter be referred to the City Finance and Governance Committee for further consideration (Link 4 view <a href="here">here</a>).
- 6. Changes from the draft Policy presented to Council on 27 February 2024 have been incorporated and contained in **Attachment A**, the amendments are shown as tracked changes as shown (Link 5 here).
- 7. A summary of changes made to the content moved from the Civic Recognition Operating Guidelines, the Adelaide Town Hall Lighting Operating Guidelines and The Civic Protocols (Part 8 of the Standing Orders) to the draft Policy are detailed in the tables below, including the revised changes from feedback received.

#### **Standing Orders**

- 8. Chapter 8 of the Standing Orders is the last substantial part of the Standing Orders to be removed.
- 9. It is noted that the CRWG was established under the Standing Orders. It proposed that CRWG is disbanded upon Council's adoption of the draft Policy and that the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) retains the authority to establish consultation mechanisms as they consider necessary in line with the draft Policy.
- 10. Upon adoption of the Policy the remaining parts of the Standing Orders should also be revoked.
- 11. The table below specifies which parts of the Standing Orders have been deleted and which would be deleted as a result of Part 3 of the recommendation.

#### **Civic Recognition Working Group (CRWG)**

- 12. The CRWG was established as a CEO working group under a now rescinded section of the Standing Orders.
- 13. A barrier identified for the CRWG is that there is no requirement to report to Council.

14. At its final meeting on 6 February 2024, the CRWG endorsed the draft Policy and the consequential disbandment of the group.

#### **Section 41 Civic Recognition Committee**

15. A report will be provided to the City Finance and Governance Committee at the next committee structure review investigating the feasibility of establishing a committee under section 41 of the *Local Government Act* 1999 (SA) for the purposes of Civic Recognition.

#### **City Community Services and Culture Committee**

- 16. As per its terms of Terms of Reference, the City Community Services and Culture Committee (Link 6 view here) is responsible for recommendations to Council to assist in the achievement of the celebration for diverse community, culture and creativity.
- 17. It is proposed that any decision that requires a Council decision as delegated in the draft Policy is first referred to the City Community Services and Culture Committee for consideration and recommendation to Council.

#### **Next Steps**

18. Should the City Finance and Governance Committee make a recommendation to Council, the draft Policy will be presented to Council on 27 May 2024 for consideration.
