MOTION ON NOTICE

Councillor Janet Giles will move a motion and seek a seconder for the matter shown below to facilitate consideration by the Council:

'Following the successful trial of 50 cent fares for all rides on public transport in Brisbane, Council approach the state government to explore the possibility of implementation a similar scheme in Adelaide considering the positive outcomes for cost of living, traffic congestion, business, and the environment. '

ADMINISTRATION COMMENT

- 1. The Queensland Government's 50 cent public transport fare trial ran for six months from 5 August 2024 to 4 February 2025. As of 10 February 2025, the 50 cent public transport fares were made permanent by the Queensland Government.
- 2. Due to the trial's success in increasing public transport usage and providing financial relief, the Queensland Government has committed \$1.5 billion over the next four years to continue the initiative.
- 3. On 1 July 2024, Adelaide Metro increased fares across all services by nearly 3%. However, the South Australian Government has also introduced a number of initiatives to support the use of Public Transport.
- 4. These initiatives are targeted at concessions to assist specific groups to enhance affordability and accessibility and include:
 - 4.1. Free Travel for Seniors: Since July 2022, South Australian Seniors Card holders have benefited from free travel on all Adelaide Metro services at all times. (https://www.seniorscard.sa.gov.au/benefits/public-transport)
 - 4.2. Concessions for Health Care Card Holders: From 1 January 2025, individuals holding a Health Care Card are eligible for concession fares on public transport, providing a 50% discount. (<u>Targeted Concession Enhancements for Better Living | DHS</u>)
 - 4.3. Student and Child Concessions: Students with approved student identification cards are entitled to concession rates on public transport. Additionally, accompanied children under 5 years of age travel free at all times on public transport. (https://www.sa.gov.au/topics/education-and-learning/financial-help-scholarships-and-grants/travel-concession-and-allowances)
 - 4.4. South Australian Transport Subsidy Scheme (SATSS): Subsidised taxi fares from 50% to up 75% are available for individuals with disabilities that limit their ability to use public transport. (South Australian Transport Subsidy Scheme)
 - 4.5. Free Tram Travel Zone: Tram travel is free between Port Road and South Terrace, promoting convenient movement across key city locations

- 5. Should Council resolve to support the proposed motion, the following actions will be undertaken:
 - 5.1. Administration will undertake further investigations into the success of the fare reduction initiated by the Queensland Government.
 - 5.2. A letter will be prepared for the Lord Mayor to send to the Premier requesting State Government's consideration of implementing a reduced flat rate fare for all South Australian public transport services on a six-month trial basis.
