## Natural Systems, Cultural Landscapes and Climate Resilience

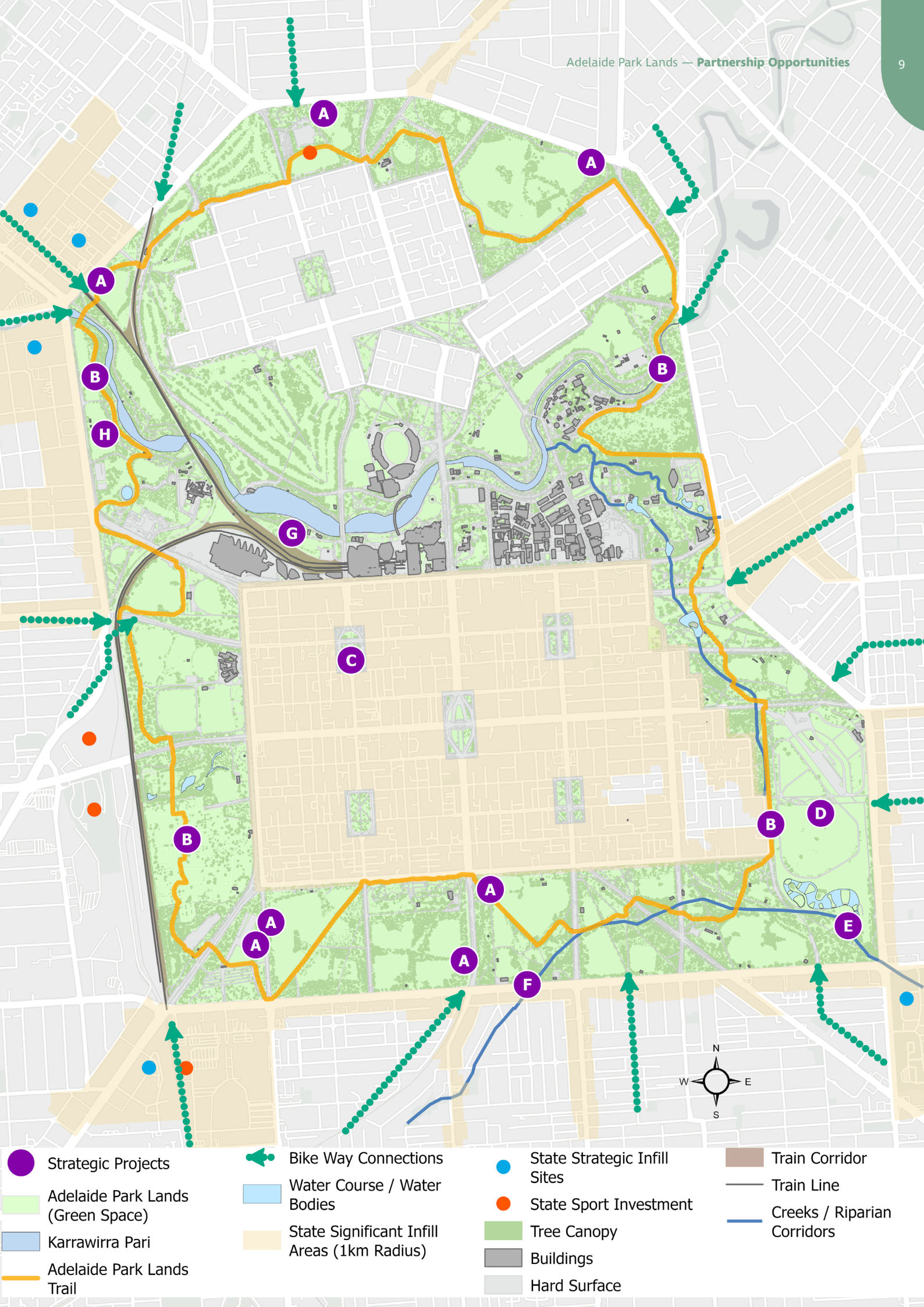

The City of Adelaide has committed approximately \$25 million over 10 years to redevelop a number of significant community buildings in the Adelaide Park Lands.

Co-investment is required from Federal, State and adjoining Councils in order for these priority projects to be realised.

The Adelaide Park Lands is the home of metropolitan sport and provides an ideal landscape for kids and families to be active.

The community buildings that support both our local and regional level sporting clubs need to respond to the community expectations especially to increase female and youth participation.

Enhancing the 19.5 km Adelaide Park Lands Trail will create a connected Greenway linking the Park Lands with inner metropolitan Adelaide. Aligned with the Greater Adelaide Regional Plan and State Government priorities for liveability, sustainability, and climate resilience, the Greenway will improve access to key facilities, encourage recreation and community use, and establish a biodiverse, shaded corridor that supports both people and nature.

Implementing a bold vision to transform one of the city’s key urban spaces will create a **Greener, Safer** and more **Inclusive** public open space to better serve a growing and increasingly diverse city community.

The Square will be transformed by redirecting and maintaining important traffic movement to enable a re-balance of roadway to increase green open space to provide a front yard for residents, third space for students and destination for workers and visitors. It will celebrate Kaurna culture alongside colonial history.

Status:	Detailed Design / Shovel Ready

Victoria Park / Pakapakanthi (Park 16) has long been an iconic park for major events, sport, recreation and environmental protection. It is the most frequented informal recreation park and major event location within the Adelaide Park Lands. To realise the master plan for Victoria Park / Pakapakanthi (Park 16), partnerships are needed to expand offerings for a growing population in the city and at Glenside.





# Restore Riparian (creek and waterway) Corridors

## Letting Nature Thrive for Nature's Sake

Project value:	\$10m estimated
Partnership theme:	Natural Systems, Cultural Landscapes and Climate Resilience
Outcomes:	Thriving riparian corridors allowing for increased recreational and tourism opportunities
We are seeking:	Multi-level government and Community Group partners
Status:	Planning / Delivery Stage

Partnerships are needed to realign and naturalise creek networks to improve water quality, biodiversity movement and fauna habitat in the Adelaide Park Land, delivering a greener, wilder more climate resilient landscape.

The integration of informal recreation and nature play, boardwalks and walking trails, wayfinding and interpretive signage will allow the community to interact with creeks and waterways whilst protecting the natural environment.

With significant investment in Southwark, Bowden and the new Women's and Children's Hospital, and further residential and commercial opportunities along Port Road, there is a significant opportunity to develop a strong partnership between multiple Local Governments and the State Government to capitalise on the future of Tulya Wardli / Bonython Park (Park 27).

The delivery of a Master Plan and staged capital delivery will enable the development of spaces that respond to population growth, climate change, interface with the new Women's and Children's Hospital, and provide safe and accessible connections to the health, education, events and the city.

Outcomes:	A more sustainable and climate resilient Adelaide Park Lands using recycled water
We are seeking:	Multi-level government partners
Status:	Scoping Stage

Growth around the Adelaide Park Lands will increase use and demand for higher quality open spaces.

Partnerships in sustainable water supply throughout the Adelaide Park Lands will provide opportunities to improve our sporting landscapes, provide greening and cooling opportunities, and increase amenity and areas for activation.

## Caring for Country

The Caring for Country Plan will encompass the whole of the Kaurna Peoples Native Determination Area. Once developed it will help inform approaches to Caring for Country.

Introduction of an Adelaide Park Lands Open Space Offset Scheme or Adelaide Park Lands Overlay to unlock investment in the Adelaide Park Lands through an amendment to the State Government's Planning and Design Code.

Be a part of increasing tree canopy cover in the Adelaide Park Lands, prioritising areas that are the most vulnerable to heat and where tree canopy is at risk from climate change.
