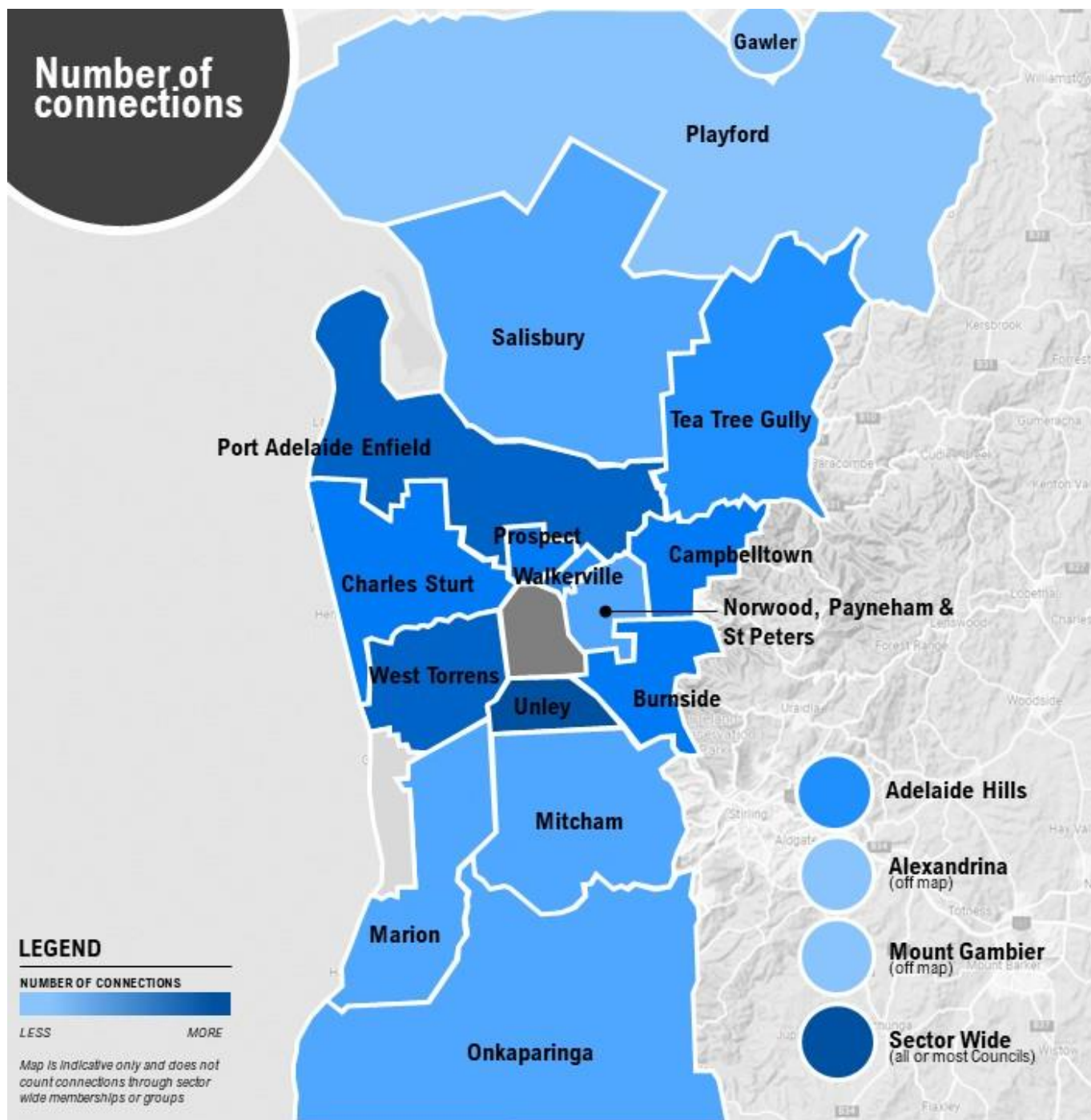


CITY OF ADELAIDE (2022) LOCAL GOVERNMENT PARTNERSHIPS

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Shared Services

Greenwaste and Mulch

Collection of greenwaste and the supply of mulch *Walkerville (greenwaste only). Mulch: Campbelltown, Charles Sturt, Port Adelaide Enfield, West Torrens.*

IT infrastructure partnerships

The Connected Council initiative is a grass-roots initiative started by City of Adelaide enable metro councils to connect to City of Adelaide data centres using dedicated fibre for very little cost. The initiative enables those metro councils to use City of Adelaide as a hub to potentially access Cloud/Internet services in a more cost-effective manner. It also enables those smaller councils to host some of their infrastructure in City of Adelaide Data Centres cheaper as well. Additionally City of Adelaide provides ad-hoc networking service support to the City of Unley. *Unley, West Torrens, Onkaparinga*
Similar services being progressed with Adelaide Hills, Gawler, Holdfast Bay and Marion

Kerbside Collection Waste Collection

Joint contract with an external provider to collect kerbside waste and recycling to deliver an increase in service delivered and cost-reductions for ratepayers. *Charles Sturt, Marion, Port Adelaide Enfield*

One Card network

This collaborative network has connected the systems of more than 130 public libraries across South Australia so members of the community can borrow and return items from participating libraries regardless of the Council area they reside in, using their current library card

Greater Adelaide Region of Council's

The role of GAROC is to lead regional advocacy, policy initiation and review, leadership engagement and capacity building in the greater Adelaide region(s). City of Adelaide Lord Mayor is a standing (permanent) member of this group.
Membership is rotated through metro councils.

Indigenous Land Use Agreement (ILUA)

Signatory to the Kaurna People Native Title Settlement ILUA, an Indigenous Land Use Agreement with 28 other Councils that seeks to streamline consultation in relation to Kaurna cultural heritage matters.

Regional Climate Change Planning

A collaborative partnership with the Eastern Region Alliance (ERA) Councils to develop a Climate Change Adaptation Plan for the eastern region. This deliverable is a requirement of the State Government's Climate Change Adaptation

Framework and is being funded by state and federal governments and participating councils

Networks and information sharing

Aboriginal Employment Industry Cluster for Local Government

Community Managers network

A network of staff that aims to lead Local Government in responding to the changing nature of communities, community services and community development. A Community Managers Network Conference is held bi-annually.

Discipline Specific Networks and sharing staff expertise

There are a range of discipline specific networks including but not limited to Parks and Leisure Australia, Open Space Planners Network, Public Libraries SA and Landscape Architects. On an ad hoc and sometimes regular basis a range of staff expertise and knowledge is shared with other local Councils in South Australia and beyond.

Eastern Collaborative Project

Co-ordinating group of local government, Federal Government Grant Managers and not for profit organisations who come together to discuss operational issues with the Commonwealth Home Support Programme, share resources, conduct workshops and to stay informed on all Aged Care funding decisions that affect the delivery of services to older community members.

Local Government Professionals and other Council staff networks

A group that promotes co-operation, learning and information exchange across local government professionals and manages a range of networks including those for Compliance and Authorised Persons, Women, Youth, HR and General Managers

Recreation and Sport network

A network of staff and professionals to discuss recreation and sport issues, challenge each other's thinking, to network and share ideas, and to advocate on issues relating to recreation and sport.

Brown Hill Keswick Creeks (BHKC) Stormwater Board

City of Adelaide is a member of this subsidiary which works to manage implementation of the approved Stormwater Management Plan, and assume responsibility for the construction, management and ongoing maintenance of all flood mitigation works as part of the BHKC Stormwater Project.
