MOTION ON NOTICE

Councillor Khera will move a motion and seek a seconder for the matter shown below to facilitate consideration by the Council:

'That the Administration install tiles to the top and sides, of the base of the heritage Rundle Mall fountain, in a heritage colour or colours complementary to the fountain.'

ADMINISTRATION COMMENT

- 1. Manufactured around 1887 by Handyside and Co. Ltd, England, the fountain was originally one of a pair located in front of the Exhibition Building on North Terrace. The two fountains are believed to be the first fountain/s erected in Adelaide.
- 2. The fountain (ironwork) and surround are not heritage listed.
- 3. After being restored in 1995, the fountain was relocated to its present location outside the entrance to Adelaide Arcade in Rundle Mall. The new surround was large, round in shape with a blue base.
- 4. The current fountain surround was designed to complement the Rundle Mall design as part of the redevelopment works in 2013-14 with extensive consultation undertaken as part of the redevelopment.
- 5. The design took into consideration:
 - The granite tiles match Rundle Mall granite paving.
 - 5.2. The fountain surround has had a variety of colours, shapes and sizes over the years and is separate to the ironwork of the fountain.
 - 5.3. Dark coloured granite is easy to clean, maintain and replace.
 - 5.4. The granite tiles have relevant slip resistance ratings.
 - 5.5. A coloured tiled surround could detract from the coloured ironwork of the fountain, which is deemed the focal point of the installation.
- 6. Based on the extensive consultation undertaken during the Rundle Mall redevelopment works, and the current fountain restoration works, it is not recommended that the current base be replaced with tiles.
- 7. Should the motion be carried, careful consideration would need to be undertaken for the design in terms of the suitability of alternative tiles including colour, maintenance and safety.
